

Course: Subluxation: The Unique Focus of The Chiropractic Profession

This course presents a history of the use of term subluxation; an animal model used in subluxation research, and introduces the concept of different subluxation syndromes that may accompany subluxations in the various regions of the spine. It concludes with a discussion of issues surrounding the term subluxation and makes recommendations for continued use of the term by the chiropractic profession.
